

## New Permanent Z-Gates

### Customer Benefits:

The Z-Gates provide convenient access to flights from a concourse located adjacent to the Main Terminal.

### Project Description:

The original airline gates in the lower level of the Terminal (T-Gates) were constructed as temporary facilities. The T-Gates were removed to be replaced by new permanent gates constructed both east and west of the current Airport Traffic Control Tower. Construction of the permanent Z-Gates has been designed to take place in phases. Construction of the first phase, the East Z-Gates, was completed in the spring of 2005. The first passenger air service from the Z-Gates commenced August 1, 2005.

The East Z-Gates are furnished with counters, holdrooms, restrooms, concessions, airline operations offices, and other terminal services. The finishes are similar to the Terminal facilities already in place, keeping with the character of the original design of the Dulles Terminal.

Further Z-Gate construction will be coordinated with the construction of the nearby Main Terminal Airport Train Station.
